Seeing the sentient beings of the nembutsu throughout the worlds, countless as particles, in the ten quarters, the Buddha grasps and never abandons them and therefore is named, "Amida."

The first weekend of May marked another successful food bazaar at the Buddhist Church of Florin. I cannot express my gratitude enough to our bazaar committee, Ann Tsukamoto and Norma Nakata, in addition to the chairs of each group and all of the countless volunteers who helped make this bazaar another fruitful fundraiser for the temple.

That weekend I was recruited by Lois Kashiwase to assist with the rolling of makizushi. Although I worried about my abilities to prepare and roll the sushi correctly and beautifully, I was happy to help since it was a task that made me feel even more included in my new Sangha. With Mrs. Myrna Hitomi's encouragement, I even prepared a few ohagi, which was also very fun to do.

Since I was a beginner at rolling makizushi, my station was set up next to Lois. She instructed me to lay the piece of nori down and then cover most of it with the seasoned rice. "Don't squish too hard," Lois said as she showed me how to spread the rice out evenly over the sheet of nori. Then we placed the shiitake mushrooms in a row, followed by the kanpyo, celery, and egg with a sprinkling of dried shrimp. Then came the rolling, which seemed like the most nerve-wracking part. I wanted to make sure that I rolled it tight enough to keep everything from falling out, but I also wanted to make sure that I did not squish it into one big blob of rice.

I must have been hungry while rolling the makizushi because I kept thinking about how much I like shiitake mushrooms. However, every ingredient in the roll looked really appetizing. Each of the ingredients are well seasoned or have their own particular taste and texture, which pairs well with the other elements of the roll. Because of this artfully delicious pairing, makizushi is not only pretty when served, but also very tasty.

Makizushi can be very symbolic of our Sangha and Buddhism. Each of us brings our own experiences, views, and personalities to our temple, which makes us unique and special individuals. This is similar to the various flavors and ingredients of the makizushi. The large amount of tiny grains of rice that it takes to make one roll is unknown, but must be acknowledged and appreciated. This is likened to the countless conditions of our lives, seen and unseen, that allow us to be alive in this present moment. In addition, the nori that binds and holds everything together in makizushi represents the Buddha's teachings. Nori is like the grasp and embrace of Amida Buddha's wisdom and compassion for all of us.

Although we all have different qualities that make us individuals, we must also acknowledge the interdependence of all lives to live harmoniously together and the Buddha-Dharma that binds us.

Security Alert

The Buddhist Church of Florin has experienced break-ins into the church facilities. The following policy is effective immediately to prevent future break-ins and people looking for recyclables lying around on church grounds.

Metal Items

Do not drop off recyclable metal items (e.g. lawn mowers, radiators, pots/pans, scrape metal, etc.) at the church. The Buddhist Church of Florin is **no longer** recycling metal items.

EWASTE Items

EWASTE 4 Good will pick up and recycle for free with proceeds going to the Buddhist Church of Florin. Make sure you reference the Buddhist Church of Florin when you schedule the pickup of items so the church receives the proceeds.

CRV Cans and Bottles (glass/plastic)

BWA 100th Anniversary Renovation Project Fundraiser

John Marshall Textile Exhibit & Sale

Planning BWA President Judie Miyao & John Marshall first discussed the possibility of a fundraising trunk show one year ago. At that time John offered to donate 100 percent of his proceeds to the Anniversary Renovation Project.



John was born and raised in the Florin area and learned to write and speak Japanese at the Florin Language School. When he was 17, he moved to Japan where he has spent his life researching and sharing traditional Japanese textiles and techniques. He is now internationally known for his art. This event at Florin on April 21, 2018, was his way of thanking the Florin Japanese community. It included the sale of garments and textiles from Japan. Items for sale included bolts of Japanese silks and cottons, traditional formal and casual clothing, and a wide

array of obi & other kimono accessories.



There was a story presentation of the Grateful Crane teaching about the importance of compassion and reaching out to help those in need. The second presentation included a collection of



garments worn by Emperor Meiji.

In addition to sale proceeds, John generously donated several items from the floor used for the raffle drawings. **Lois Tanaka** was the grand prize winner of a beautiful kimono.

Arigato - Again, it took "a village" of many individuals & other church affiliates to have this successful event. On the day previous to the event, many of the **LOTUS men** hung numerous banners & helped with table setup, **LOTUS women** prepped for the bento lunch and **BWA women** assisted with unpacking and displaying of hundreds of Japanese-related sale items.
